SEATBELTS

Seatbelts dramatically reduce risk of death and serious injury.

Among drivers and front-seat passengers, seat belts reduce the risk of death by 45% and cut the risk of serious injury by 50%.

CELL PHONES

Texting while driving causes a 400% increase in time spent with your eyes off the road. Using a hand-held mobile phone while driving a CMV can result in driver disqualification. Penalties can by up to \$2,750 for drivers. 365

SPEEDING

Speed increases perception-reaction distance, braking distance, and stopping distance.

Remember to reduce speed in adverse road and weather conditions and always slow down in work zones.

OUT OF SERVICE VIOLATIONS

From 2019-2021, the average vehicle out-of-service rate was 27.67%. That means for every 100 CMVs inspected in MN, 27 were placed out-of-service for a critical safety issue. In 2022, the vehicle out-of-service rate reached over 35%.
